The Friendship Garden will host the worm composting workshop. Instructor is Brian Rosa, Organic Recycling Specialist NC DENR, Division of Pollution Prevention and Environmental Assistance (DPPEA). Brian will give a composting and vermicomposting overview with specific emphasis on setting up a mid-scale system. He will help attendees set up a "worm wigwam" in the Friendship Trays garden that will compost the 10 pounds of food scraps per day that come out of the Friendship Trays kitchen.

Agenda: 9:45, coffee; 10 a.m., overview; Noon, lunch provided by Friendship Trays partner Community Culinary School of Charlotte; afternoon, setting up the "worm wigwam," Q&A.

Cost: Bring a tub of your red wigglers from your home compost. Think of it as worm college. You have raised your precious worms well. Now it's time to send them off to be productive and give back to the community. If your separation anxiety is too strong (or you don't have any worms at home yet), consider donating \$20 to pay for one pound of composting worms.
